Philosophy and Goals:

Singing is a skill. Skills need to be practiced to improve. I am expecting every student to give their best effort while learning new singing skills. Participation in class will be REQUIRED! Singing, like most skills, becomes more fun as one's abilities increase.

Course Objectives

- 2. Students will be able to accurately count and notate the following rhythms and their corresponding rest values.
- 3. Students will be able to accurately sing their assigned parts, both alone and in a group.
- 4. Students will be able to visually and aurally recognize various genres through identifiable characteristics of each genres' cultural origin, authentic instrumentation, and physical performance.
- 5. Students will participate in multiple performance opportunities and practice proper performance etiquette; both as a performer and as an audience member.
- 6. Students will work cooperatively, equally, and effectively in groups through projects, performances, and classroom activities.
- 7. Students will discover connections between the arts and other subject areas through exploration, collaboration, and classroom discussion.
